

Integrated Management System Policy

Londonderry Port and Harbour Commissioners is a Trust Port established by Act of Parliament in 1854 and the Londonderry Port and Harbour Act Northern Ireland (1970). The Port serves the North West of Ireland and its hinterland.

Activities on site include the loading and discharge from vessels of bulk materials, such as coal, animal feeds, cement, glass minerals, fertilisers as well as timber and fresh fish. LPHC also provides a marine service which includes but is not limited to towage, pilotage, navigation, and conservancy.

It is the policy of Londonderry Port to provide the best possible service to its customers and considers no aspect of its business as being of greater importance than the protection of the environment, prevention of pollution and the elimination of hazards and reduce OH&S risks. To achieve this goal, LPHC is committed to operating an Integrated Management System in compliance with ISO:14001 Environmental Management, ISO:9001 Quality Management and ISO 45001 Occupational Health & Safety Management.
